NOT ALLOWED

- + vote
- + contribute money to a campaign or party
- + attend political rallies and fundraisers
- + run for office in a non-partisan election
- run for office as an independent candidate in certain localities (including Washington, D.C. and its suburbs)
- + participate in a referendum campaign
- + display a political bumper sticker on a personal vehicle

- work for a political campaign or party (such as by stuffing envelopes, making calls for votes, giving speeches, etc.)
- hold office in a political party
- fundraise for a candidate or political party (except that a union member may fundraise from a non-subordinate union member for a union fund)
- engage in political activities when on duty*
- engage in political activities when in a Government building or on Government premises*
- use the authority of one's Government position to influence an election – run for office in a partisan election (other than as an independent candidate in a local election in certain areas)
